Biography

Singer, Songwriter and Musician

His first band The Young Homebuyers formed in Adelaide in 1980, then moved to Melbourne. Recorded one album for Polygram in 1982 and released singles Take One Step and She's A Girl, described by Glenn A. Baker as one of the two great Australian pop singles. Supported Pretenders and Motels on national tours.

Antidote comedy-cabaret band The Latest Thing From England dressed up in silly clothes and performed early 1980s covers in Melbourne.

Returning to Adelaide in 1985, he formed a three-piece pop group Play Loud. Released an independent single Write It Down In Stone, on the Greasy Pop label the first indie single to achieve mainstream airplay on SA-FM.

Formed The Every Brothers in 1986. Released mini album Picks and Pens. In 1987, recorded single This Town, which was picked up by Polygram. Recorded an album Everyone as The Everys. Toured nationally with Toni Childs in 1989.

He released two solo home-recorded albums Here & Now (1990) and Louder Than Words (1991) on the Greasy Record Company/Festival imprint, both of which received JJJ airplay.

In the early 1990s, he got married, became a father and worked in a proper job before forming Splurge in 1997, which achieved his life-long ambition to be in a band which surived its second album!

In the late 1990s, The Every Brothers not so much reformed, as re-incarnated, with Greg Arnold as an honorary brother, releasing two albums of new material, as well as a retrospective two-CD collection on Round Records.

Splurge's first album was released independently in 1998. The band's second album Heavy Weather in 2002 on Sydney label Laughing Outlaw gathered accolades internationally following its release in the UK and USA.

The third Splurge album Cure For The Cure, completed in 2005, was relased in 2007 on Melbourne label Popboomerang and was partly funded by a VicArts grant. International reviews lauded the album's strong material and high production values.
